Dear Resident:

The Division Resource Officers from the 7<sup>th</sup> Division would like to welcome you to our division. The 7<sup>th</sup> Division is located at 7201 Outer Loop and our contact number is 574-2133. The 7<sup>th</sup> Division is committed to serving the communities in our division. We would like to share the below information regarding crime and quality of life issues.

First, we hope that you become active in a block watch or apartment watch program if you have one. Watch captains are a valuable tool in our efforts to get important information out to the community about crime trends or public safety. You can also visit LMPD's crime prevention website by going to [www.louisvilleky.org](http://www.louisvilleky.org) and typing "crime prevention" in the search window to learn important safety tips about home, car, and personal safety.

This year the 7<sup>th</sup> Division has experienced a 10% reduction in crime and we are committed to keeping crime as low as possible so we keep your quality of life as high as possible. In a division that has an area of approximately 100 square miles this requires working together with the community. One of the most common crimes committed in our division (and in Louisville as a whole) involves valuables stolen from cars. Car doors are frequently left unlocked or, if locked, valuables such as pocket books, money, and electronics (GPS, cell phones, etc) are in the open and make an enticing target. Remember, it is not where you live that determines if you will be a victim of a crime, it is how you live. Always practice crime prevention habits.

If you need to file police report for a non-violent crime and you do not have any witness information you can do so just by picking up a telephone and calling the Telephone Reporting Unit at 574-4661 MON-FRI, 6AM to Midnight. Otherwise, police, fire, and EMS dispatch is 574-2111 (option 5). Also, 574-LMPD is a confidential number to report criminal activity in YOUR community. On the back, there is a form to catalog your valuables in the unfortunate event that you are ever a victim of a property crime. Please take the time to catalog your traceable valuables and keep this form secure in an area that someone would not be looking for those same valuables. Thank you.

You are being contacted because there has been an expressed interest in starting a Neighborhood Block Watch in our neighborhood with the Louisville Metro Police Department. We would like to get as many people involved in this program as possible. Neighborhood Block Watch programs are designed to establish a partnership between our neighborhood and the police in the division which we reside, in our case the 7<sup>th</sup> Division. To become a neighborhood watch we have to: have a meeting, elect officers, and then register with Louisville Metro as a block watch – after our second meeting we will be eligible for Block Watch Signs.

Please consider being part of our future neighborhood watch program. We will receive routine crime maps from the Seventh Division about crime trends in our area as well as important crime prevention tips. Furthermore, we will be able to have members of the Louisville Metro Police Department attend our meetings so we can ask questions or get one-on-one advice from the police officers who work in our area. It has been recommended to us by the LMPD Block Watch Coordinator to have a Block Watch Captain as the primary point of contact. This person will be responsible for distributing e-mails to Co-Watch Captains and then have a Co-Captain for every street who can receive e-mails and create an e-mail tree as well.

The program is a proven success in preventing crime and enhancing the quality of life in neighborhoods. It lets criminals know that we care about our community and we will not be a target for crime. Please consider being involved and making a difference in our neighborhood. Please contact me if you can attend our meeting or want to be part of the block watch program.
